

## Fourteen State College Students Chosen for 1940-41 Who's Who in American Educational Institutions

Boys have the edge on the girls in the choice of "Who's Who" in American Colleges and Universities at State College.

Eight boys and six girls were selected from the local group of outstanding students. Only seniors and juniors were eligible.

Since students are not eligible for two years in succession, A. E. Hatch, Jr., Lois Dunkle and Charles Graham were not included this year, as they were on last year's list.

Ten of the students on the selected list are seniors, four are juniors.

Miss Carwardine, daughter of Mrs. Chester Carwardine of this city, is president of the Pep club, member of Associated Women Students, Zeta Tau Alpha sorority, Student Commission and Intramural Council. She is honorary Lieut. Colonel of the R. O. T. C. battalion, and was last year's homecoming queen. Miss Carwardine is a senior.

Jane Bronson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. David Bronson of Las Cruces, especially talented in dramatics, has had leading roles in plays given at State College since her first year in college. She is a member of Zeta Tau Alpha, Pep club, Phi Mu Tau and Student Commission. She is a junior.

Miss Mary Louise Armstrong, junior, daughter of S. B. Armstrong of State College, is also a Zeta Tau Alpha and Phi Mu Tau. She is co-business manager of the Pep club, and secretary-treasurer of the Student Commission. Miss Armstrong was princess for the Catholic University at the Sun Carnival, January 1.

Miss Jeanette Linton is president of Chi Omega sorority at State College, and secretary of the senior class. She is a member of the Greek Council, Pep club, Group Life Council and Home Ec. club. Miss Linton is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. D. T. Linton of Mesilla.

Miss Betty Jo Poe, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Poe of Mesilla Park, is editor of the Swastika this year, was society editor of the Round-Up last year, and with her sister, Rachel, was
