

Cartano New Chamber Chief

The Seattle Chamber of Commerce turned to the legal profession for the second straight year today to name John Daniel Cartano president.

Cartano succeeds Wheeler Grey, also an attorney.

Cartano, 52, was born in Seattle. He attended the University of Washington and Harvard Law School. He has practiced here since 1934, specializing in corporation law.

Three men were elected vice presidents. They are:

Marvin E. Burke, president of the Sportcaster Co.; J. E. Pendergast, division manager of Shell Oil Co., and James M. Ryan, president of University Properties, Inc.

Volney Richmond, Jr., president of the Northern Commercial Co., was elected treasurer. John N. Rupp, attorney, was re-elected general counsel.

The new officers will begin one-year terms September 5.

The new president has been active in the Chamber of Commerce more than 20 years. He has served as honorary counsel and has been a director.

During the Second World War, Cartano, a Navy lieutenant commander, won a Navy and Marine Corps Medal for action during the assault on Guadalcanal.

Cartano is a past vice president of the World Affairs Council and a past president of the Seattle Chapter, United Nations Association.
